NOTICE OF RACE

[NP] denotes a rule which may not be protested by another boat. This changes RRS 60.1(a) and 63.2(a).

[DP] denotes a rule for which the penalty is at the discretion of the protest committee.

1. Rules

- 1.1. The event is governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2. The WASZP Class Rules shall apply.
- 1.3. The US Sailing Prescriptions to the RRS shall apply.
- 1.4. RRS Appendix T, Arbitration will apply.
- 1.5. RRS Appendix V, Alternative Penalties will apply.
- 1.6. The current version of the 'Appendix HS - High Speed Rules', shall apply.

2. Sailing Instructions

- 2.1. The Sailing Instructions (SIs) will be available at Competitors meeting and online before 10 September 2026.
- 2.2. For differences between the NOR and SI, the SIs shall prevail.

3. Communication

- 3.1. Changes in Sailing Instructions shall be made in writing before a race by posting in proper time on the official notice board.
- 3.2. The official notice board is the online clubspot website.
- 3.3. Mandatory Competitors Meeting will be held Saturday, 12 September, 2026.

4. Eligibility and Entry

- 4.1. The event is open to boats of the WASZP class.
- 4.2. Every competitor shall be a member of their national WASZP Class association.
- 4.3. Official entries must complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.
- 4.4. Boats may enter by registering online at: <https://racehub.waszp.com/events>

5. Fees

- 5.1. All entries must be filed prior to 10 September 2026.
- 5.2. Early Entry fee before 1 September 2026, is \$150.
- 5.3. Entry fee after 1 September 2026, is \$200.

6. Crew Limitations

- 6.1. Crew limitations will be in accordance with WASZP Class rules.

7. Advertising

- 7.1. If requested by the Organizing Authority, boats shall display advertising chosen and supplied by the Organizing Authority. This may include a requirement to wear supplied podium bibs during competition.



7.2 All Competitors must wear supplied Pinnies for the regatta while on the water.

8. Event Format

- 8.1. Seven races are scheduled and three (3) will make a series.
- 8.2. A three-minute starting sequence will be used. Following the RRS Appendix U.
- 8.3. Additional starts will be initiated soon after each race completes.

9. Schedule

- 9.1. Friday, 11 September:
 - 1600- 19:00 Check in and Practice Sailing
- 9.2. Saturday, 12 September:
 - 0930 Mandatory Competitors Briefing, PYSF Container - Chesapeake Campus
 - 1130 First Warning Signal
- 9.3. Sunday, 13 September:
 - 0930 Mandatory Competitors Briefing, PYSF Container - Chesapeake Campus
 - 1130 First Warning Signal
 - 1530 No Warning Signal After

10. Equipment Inspection

- 10.1. A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the rules.
- 10.2. The penalty for infringement of a class rule may be less than disqualification.
- 11. Clothing and Equipment
 - 11.1. Clothing and equipment shall be in accordance with the class rules. See WICA Class Rule C.4.
 - 11.2. At all times when afloat except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing, the crew shall wear an appropriate personal flotation device.

12. Venue

- 12.1. Racing will be in the South San Francisco Bay either just south of the San Mateo Bridge or adjacent to Bair Island.
- 12.2. The race venue and plan will be announced at the competitors meeting each day, the venue location may change depending on conditions.

14. Penalty System

- 14.1. No on-the-water observers will be utilized for this regatta.

15. Scoring

- 15.1. This regatta will be scored using low-point scoring per RRS 90.3.
- 15.2. The competitor's worst result will be discarded after 5 races (Changes RRS A2.1).

16. Launching & Support Facilities

- 16.1. There is a public plastic floating dock and ramp that will be used. The local rowing teams use the ramp so we ask that we give them priority.



- 16.2. Boat trailers and dollies can be stored in the PYSF dry storage yard.

19. Data Protection

19.1. The personal information you provide to the Organizing Authority may be used to facilitate future participation in the event. Your personal information will be stored and used in accordance with the Organizing Authority's privacy policy. When required by the rules, personal information may be shared with US Sailing, your national authority and/or World Sailing. The results of the event and the outcome of any hearing or appeal will be published.

20. Rights to Use Names and Likeness

20.1. Competitors automatically grant to the Organizing Authority without payment the right in perpetuity to make, use and show any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or filmed television of or relating to the event.

21. Risk Statement

21.1. RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. By his/her entry, each competitor accepts the responsibility for these risks regardless of potential harm severity.

22. Insurance

- 22.1. Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance.
22.2. The Organizing Authority does not accept any responsibility for verifying that a boat has valid third-party insurance.

23. Prizes

- 23.1. Prizes will be presented to the boats finishing in: 1st-3rd overall
