NOTICE OF RACE

The notation '[NP]' in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

1 RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 Sail Canada prescriptions shall apply.

- 3.2 [DP] While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 The event is open to all WASZP Sailors.

- 4.3 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.

7.3 On the last scheduled day of racing no warning signal will be made after 1400.

8 EQUIPMENT

8.1 All boats must conform with the WASZP Class Rules

8.2 Competitors may choose to sail with the size of wing or sail they wish and these may be changed at any time.

8.3 Sail Numbers will be displayed clearly on the competitors race bib

8.4 The event will be judged using Vakaros & Racesense, these can be chartered from WeCanFoil for a small additional fee. Contact agustin@wecanfoil.org.

9 VENUE

9.1 The event is hosted by the Royal Nova Scotia Yacht Squadron in Halifax, Nova Scotia.

9.2 Racing will take place in Halifax Harbour. NoR Addendum A shows the location of the racing area.

10 PENALTY SYSTEM

RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the standard 5 points per infraction per race.

11 SCORING

11.1 Three (3) races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

11.2 (a) When fewer than five (5) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

(b) When from five (5) to nine (9) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

- (c) When from ten (10) to fourteen (14) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two (2) worst scores.
- (d) When fifteen (15) or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her three (3) worst scores.
- 11.3 Should there be slalom racing, the scoring will be defined in the Sailing Instructions.
- 12 **SUPPORT PERSON VESSELS**
Support vessels shall register themselves by email to sailnow@rnsys.com and check in with the race officer.
- 13 **BERTHING**
[DP] Boats shall be kept in their assigned places while in the boat park.
- 14 **DATA PROTECTION**
By participating in the event, competitors grant to the Organizing Authority and their sponsors the right in perpetuity to make, use and show, from time to time at their discretion, any photography, audio and video recordings, or other reproductions of them made at the venue or on the water from the time of their arrival at the venue, until their final departure, without compensation.
- 15 **RISK STATEMENT**
RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. **Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.**
- 16 **INSURANCE**
Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance. The Organizing Authority does not accept any responsibility for verifying that a boat has valid third-party insurance.
- 17 **PRIZES (Will be awarded independently for Windfoil & Wingfoil)**
- 17.1 First overall to be named 2026 Canfoil Cup Foilboard Champion.
- 17.2 Top three (3) overall.
- 17.3 Top female competitor.
- 17.5 There may also be additional awards at the discretion of the Organizing Authority.
- 17.6 For this inaugural event, The Canadian High School/University titles will be awarded during the CanFoil cup. The results will come from overall placements, regardless of rig size. There will be awards for both female and male sailors from both the High School and the University Level.

This awarding will take place, should there be more than 4 eligible competitors in each category.
